Title IX Basic Facts

1. Title IX protects all students, staff and faculty from sexual misconduct, including harassment, discrimination and violence.
2. Pitt is proactive in fostering an inclusive environment free of sexual discrimination.
3. Pitt has established procedures for handling complaints of sex discrimination, sexual harassment or sexual violence.
4. Pitt will take action to ensure victim can continue his/her education free of ongoing sex discrimination, sexual harassment, or sexual violence.
5. Pitt does not tolerate any form of retaliation against the reporting party.
6. Talking with Title IX does not mean you have to move forward with an investigation.
